

ACTIVITY TECHNICAL FACT SHEET

a) Activity Name according to technical standards or administrative resolution:

Adventure Tourism - Off-road vehicle tour NCH 3054.

b) Region, Province, and Commune:

Metropolitan Region, Cordillera Province, San José de Maipo Commune.

c) Location where the activity takes place:

Parque Arenas Route - Cajón del Maipo, according to the attached itinerary.

d) Description of the activity detailing its location and main characteristics:

1. Object and Scope of Service

The Company organizes and operates tourist tours and adventure activities in the Metropolitan Region of Santiago and other areas agreed upon in the itinerary. Each contracted service includes only the elements expressly described in the booking confirmation and in Annex A (Itinerary and Services). Itineraries, schedules, routes, and activities may vary due to weather conditions, road status, safety, and/or requirements from authorities or providers.

1.1 General Description of the Area of Influence

“Geographic area or space whose attributes, natural or socio-cultural elements must be considered in order to define if the project or activity generates or presents any of the effects, characteristics, or circumstances of Article 11 of Law [No. 19.300], or to justify the non-existence of such effects, characteristics, or circumstances.”

Based on the previous iconography, we can define a fixed route that starts at the park entrance, always using pre-established paths created by various machinery, maintaining a distance of at least 3 meters from the center of the track as required by the park. The distance traveled by the snowmobiles does not exceed 3 kilometers per leg (outbound and return), for a total of 6 km.

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION: SNOWMOBILING

The activity consists of a guided tour on motorized vehicles specifically designed for travel over snowy terrain. Participants will drive or ride as passengers on state-of-the-art snowmobiles, following pre-established routes in high-mountain environments.

- **Difficulty Level:** Technical-Low / Physical-Medium.
- **Mandatory Requirements:** Minimum height of 1.40m (4'7"), use of helmet and safety goggles at all times.
- **Dynamics:** Includes an initial technical briefing on throttle and brake operation, as well as body weight distribution during turns. The route is led by an expert guide who sets the pace and ensures a safe path, avoiding avalanche-prone areas or crevices.
- **Environment:** Conducted in areas with high weather exposure, requiring appropriate technical clothing for low temperatures.

e) Duration of the activity or program: Approximately 8 hours.

f) Season of the year in which the activity is performed: Winter (JUNE - JULY - AUGUST).

g) Limitations and/or restrictions of the activity:

- **Minimum age to drive:** 18 years old (requires a valid driver's license).
- **Minimum age for passengers: 12 years old** (must be accompanied by a responsible adult and meet the minimum height requirement).
- **Minimum height:** 1.40 meters (4'7") (mandatory requirement to ensure passenger stability and correct use of safety equipment).
- **Physical condition:** Health status compatible with high-mountain activities. Not suitable for individuals with chronic heart conditions, recent spinal injuries, or surgeries within the last 6 months.
- **Pregnancy:** Total restriction due to the risk of vibrations, jolts, and potential impacts inherent to the route.
- **Alcohol/Drugs:** Absolute prohibition of participating under the influence of any substance that alters psychomotor capacity or judgment.

h) Required experience and technical capacity:

- **Level:** Beginner / Intermediate.
- **Technical capacity:** No prior experience in snowmobile driving is required. The participant must demonstrate the ability to follow instructions during the mandatory technical briefing and maintain basic control of the vehicle (smooth acceleration and braking).

i) Participant's personal clothing and equipment (Individual):

- **Mandatory Equipment (Provided by the company):** Certified safety helmet and goggles with UV protection.
- **Suggested Clothing (Participant's responsibility):** 3-layer system (thermal base, fleece, and waterproof jacket), snow pants, thermal gloves, mountain or snow boots (no urban sneakers), and SPF 50+ sunscreen.

j) Guides' personal clothing and equipment (Individual):

- **Clothing:** High-visibility, thermal, and waterproof institutional technical gear.
- **Safety and Emergency Equipment:** VHF/UHF radio, satellite GPS, advanced first aid kit (WFR certification), quick-mechanic tools, snow shovel, and rescue probe.

k) Insurance Information:

- The company has a valid General Liability Insurance for adventure tourism.
- Participants are informed that they may opt to purchase additional personal accident insurance if they wish.

l) Included and non-included services:

- **Included:** Certified guide, snowmobile (as per booking), helmet, goggles, technical briefing, and food services (only if specified in the contracted tour portfolio).

- **Not included:** Personal technical clothing, tips, non-specified transfers, and costs for vehicle damage derived from negligence (see Damage Annex).

m) Number of participants (Minimum and Maximum):

- **Minimum:** 2 participants.
- **Maximum:** 12 participants per departure.

n) Number of Guides according to participants:

- **Safety Ratio:** 1 responsible Guide for every 5 vehicles (snowmobiles) on the route.
- **Larger Groups:** If exceeding 5 vehicles, a second guide (Sweep or Support Guide) will be mandatory to maintain group control.

o) Actions for the proper development of the activity:

1. Maintain a safety distance of 10 meters between vehicles.
2. Prohibited to overtake the lead guide or leave the designated route.
3. Strictly follow the manual signals from the guide team.
4. In case of a fall or rollover, wait 10 minutes before resuming (after inspection).
5. Absolute respect for the natural environment and prohibition of leaving waste on the mountain.
